Defibrillators: When to Use Them and How to Find One

The Parish Council has been proud to support the provision of several defibrillators across the Parish. If someone near you goes into cardiac arrest, knowing that you will be expertly guided by the emergency services on what to do, keeping calm and acting quickly will significantly improve their chances of recovery. We believe that reading this short guide, really could make the difference between life and death.

What is a Defibrillator?

A defibrillator, also known as an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), is a life-saving device that delivers an electric shock to the heart in cases of sudden cardiac arrest.

When to Use a Defibrillator

A defibrillator should be used when someone is unresponsive and not breathing normally. If you witness a person collapse and they do not respond to verbal or physical stimuli, follow these steps:

1. Call Emergency Services – Dial 999 immediately. Listen carefully to their instructions. If you are alone with the patient, **the emergency services will fully guide you on the action to take** which may include commencing CPR.

2. CPR stands for cardiopulmonary resuscitation. It is a life-saving technique used in emergencies when someone's breathing or heartbeat has stopped. CPR involves **chest compressions** to help maintain circulation and oxygen flow until medical help arrives.

3. Defibrillator Retrieval - If you are not alone with the patient, the emergency services will advise the location of your nearest **working** defibrillator - The defibrillator closest to your location may not be working. **Only the emergency services will** have the most up to date information on your nearest **USABLE** defibrillator. This is why 999 must **always** be contacted in the first instance and on their instruction a second person should then be sent to bring back the Defibrillator.

4. The Defibrillator must be retrieved from the location advised by the emergency services. There is a list/map of these locations at the end of this article. Critically, you must remember emergency services will tell you where the nearest working the defibrillator is. This may not be the closest defibrillator as detailed on the list/map.

5. Turn on the AED and Follow Instructions – AEDs

provide clear voice prompts guiding you through the process. Don't worry if you have never used one before it will tell you exactly what to do.

6. Continue CPR – Perform chest compressions until emergency responders arrive.

Reviews of the Neighbourhood Plans for Shenstone, Little Aston and Stonnall

The plans for Shenstone and Little Aston are at the Regulation 16 stage which means they are with the independent inspectors who have been appointed to scrutinise responses to the proposals.

There is no need for a public enquiry or referendum and residents will be invited at the end of the Summer to identify which of the proposals in the plans matter most to them.

Stonnall Neighbourhood Plan is progressing very well, and our planning consultants are in the middle of writing consultation, basic conditions and modification statements. They are just a few weeks away from presenting to Lichfield District Council.

ST. PETER'S HUB, ST. PETER'S CHURCH, STONNALL

St. Peter's Hub and its collaboration with the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire has worked well by bringing live music to Stonnall in the beautiful Grade II listed church. The last musical event on Friday 23rd May was Chris Roberts, an alumni of The Royal Birmingham Conservatoire. Chris trained in classical guitar and now plays Welsh folk as part of his repertoire. Since leaving the Conservatoire he has appeared on BBC Radios 2, 3, and 4 and appeared live on Radio 3 on Easter Sunday. He has toured and recorded as a solo guitarist including the Wales National Eisteddfod, Poland and Albania. He has also appeared at Glastonbury 3 times including performing with Tanita Tikaram. Chris, together with the other half of his duo (Filkin's Drift), walked the entire Wales Coast Path carrying all their instruments and performing in a variety of different venues on their route. Chris combines classical and Welsh folk music and also sings in Welsh. Chris's performance in Stonnall was flawless and in addition to hearing his expertise on his steel stringed guitar he also played the rarely heard Welsh Crwth – a mediaeval wooden lyre. It was a truly beautiful evening – it was an incredible coup for Stonnall that Chris agreed to come to us as part of his UK tour. The musical evening included a free raffle and a free glass of wine. The evening concluded after nearly 2 hours of beautiful music.



The next concert is a break from tradition. It will be held on a Sunday afternoon on 27th July at 2.30 pm – 4.30 pm. Parish Lengthsmen update

The Stonnall Pound sign has been fully refurbished: repainted, the metal legs completed and all new retaining bolts fitted which hold the metal frame / sign to the backplate and looks excellent. New benches have also been put in place on both Stonnall Playing Field and Little Aston Recreation Ground.

On June 7th the Shenstone Brunch Club had a surprise visitor- an unexpected visit from a Food Standards/ Environment Agency inspector.

The great news is that the Brunch team were awarded another Five-star rating for all their procedures, and for full compliance required for running a "high risk" club event. The dishwasher (from a grant from the Parish) has secured the last piece of the jigsaw that was needed to comply with FSA standards to ensure the level of sterilisation required for preparing "high risk" food for the seniors in our village.

Mary Jones, the leader of the group, would like to say Thank you all for all the support and help the group have had, both from Trinity Hall and the Parish council, not forgetting Shenstone Relief Fund for giving a grant for Start-up equipment. Also, a very big special thank you to Rigid Kitchens for helping create the perfect spot for the dishwasher to live!

STONNALL CONSERVATION SOCIETY 25th ANNIVERSARY OF THE RESTORATION OF STONNALL ANIMAL POUND

Stonnall Conservation Society (SCS) was formed in 1998 and it was at one of its first meetings that restoration of Stonnall Animal Pound was discussed and agreed. An enormous amount of effort was put in by a selection of villagers and more than 200 hours were spent on the project. The whole project came to fruition in 2000 – a Millennium project completed on time. It received Grade II Listing on 27th May 2016 by Historic England. This is the only Listed Animal Pound in Staffordshire.

The 25th Anniversary of its restoration was held during the morning of Saturday 7th June 2025. As always, behind the scenes considerable effort was put in by members of the SCS committee to ensure this event was a success. Everything was provided free of charge to anyone to come to the celebration. Refreshments were served by the Scouts; a free brochure was available detailing the history of The Pound until the present time; there was an amazing collection of stones collected from land around Stonnall and a slide show of photographs from the initial restoration. David Salter, dressed as a Country Yokel, gave a short and amusing presentation about life as a Pinner (a person who managed The Pound) and just before 11.00 a large number of people walked up to The Pound in which there was a shepherd and 3 of his sheep quite happily munching away! Two of the Scouts cut the red ribbon across the gate as the Town Cryer pronounced the 25th anniversary of the restoration of the Stonnall Animal Pound together with the newly erected interpretation board with map. Despite the weather forecast of heavy rain and thunderstorms, apart from a couple of spots, it was completely dry and raincoats weren't needed! After dozens of photographs had been taken most people returned to The Community Centre for more refreshments and an opportunity to look at the display boards showing the work of the Conservation Society from writing the incredible book "Discovering Stonnall", booklets on walks around the village, photographs of numerous projects, the new brochure about The Pound, previous programmes for the Society and much, much more. It was a wonderful morning during which donations were made to both the Working Donkeys Charity (the Charity supported by the farm who had provided the sheep), Stonnall Scouts and last but not least the Stonnall Conservation Society. A big "Thank You" to all who supported us on this special day.

Update on the Additional Room Project at the Little Aston Village Hall

We are delighted to confirm that work has progressed well, and that the refurbishments to the committee room and its associated toilets were completed in time for the Bowls Club's first home match of the season. All the regular committee room users are now able to resume their activities.

Thanks to the further generous assistance from the Parish Council the additional room is now fully plastered and all the painting, finishing and fitting out work is underway. This assistance will get us to the point where the additional room can be used by most of the users who have been waiting patiently for the room to be ready. However, there will still be a lot more to be done before the project is fully completed.

We were proposing to carry out this remaining work over the course of the next few years using funds which we would accumulate from our normal small excess of income over operating costs and from any donations or other help that may be forthcoming. However, the contractor

has kindly offered to complete all the work before September providing we can assure him that we will have raised the required additional money by November. To achieve this, we have applied to ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England) who have a loan scheme that is designed specifically for Village Halls. If all goes well, everything will be completed in time for the start of the new school year, and we will be organising an open day probably during the school half term holiday.

The Management Committee and all the Hall users owe a great deal of thanks to all those who have assisted with the funding of this project, THANK YOU.
